CLASS ELIGIBILITY

Refer to Chapter 2, Section 2. Dogs may only be entered in classes for which they are eligible.

CLASS TRANSFER / MOVE UPS

Pre-trial class transfers must be received by 5:00 pm, Monday June 5 2023. AKC requires transfer requests be in writing. You may send email with subject line “Scent Work Class Transfer” to trial secretary. You must include: Dog’s registered name and AKC #, Class dog is entered in, which class the dog is to be transferred and which trials the transfer is to apply. Transfer will be acknowledged by return email.

Day to Day class transfers require a completed transfer form be turned in to trial secretary within 30 minutes of the completion of the current day’s trial for subsequent trial(s). No day of trial transfers will be accepted.

ENTERING MORE THAN ONE DOG

Handlers may not handle more than one dog in each class with the exception of the Handler Discrimination classes. Multiple dogs for the same owner(s) may be entered in the same class provided the dogs are run by different handlers.

HANDLER DISCRIMINATION DIVISON

Handler Discrimination classes are titling classes in which the targeted scent is that of the handler themselves. Handlers are required to provide their own scented articles in a plastic bag, for the Novice class, one cotton glove or cotton sock, for Advanced, Excellent, and Master, cotton balls or cotton swabs. Three qualifying scores are required to earn titles in each class.

Handlers may utilize any method they feel is best to scent their article. Suggestions include rubbing the article on the handler’s body or storing the item in dirty laundry.

DOGS ELIGIBLE TO ENTER

This trial is open to all dogs SIX (6) months of age or older that are registered with the American Kennel Club or that have AKC Limited Registration, Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP), an AKC Canine Partners listing number or approved Foundation Stock Service (FSS) breeds are eligible to participate.

Dogs with a Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP) or an AKC Canine Partners listing number must be spayed or neutered in order to compete.

Dogs with physical challenges (including amputees) are eligible to participate provided that, in the opinion of the judge, the dog displays no sign of physical discomfort and can safely complete the search. Deaf and blind dogs are allowed to enter. Females in season may not participate, aggressive dogs, or dogs suffering from an injury, or illness which may affect the dog’s physical or mental performance may not participate. No dog shall compete if it is sutured, bandaged, or has any visible wounds.

ENTRY FEES

*an entry is defined as a single run by a single dog, in a single class.
Entry fees include a \$3.50 per run AKC recording fee.

Please make checks payable to the **Georjie’s Dog Events**. **All checks received will be deposited and must clear to be considered a valid entry.**

Contact trial secretary for hand delivery or Express, UPS or FedX address. Hand delivery or Express mail, UPS or FedX entries must include the signature waiver allowing them to be left at the secretary’s address. No entry shall be made and no entry shall be accepted which specifies any conditions as to its acceptance.

Entry cancellation fee: There is a \$5.00 per class entry cancellation fee for entries received and then cancelled prior to closing.

Illegible entries will not be processed and will be returned to the exhibitor.

Returned checks/Declined Credit/Debit Transactions do not constitute a valid entry and the Trial Secretary will add a \$50.00 collection fee to the amount of each returned/declined item. This fee and entry fee will need to be paid by cash or money order or valid credit card by Monday June 5, 2023 before entry will be considered valid. No day of trial payment will be accepted. If the collection fee is not paid the exhibitor will be considered in debt to EDOC and future entries will be declined until this debt is paid. In addition, exhibitor may be placed on cash basis only for future events sponsored by EDOC.

Acknowledgments: Entries will be acknowledged as they are received or after entries close, with acknowledgment and judging program to address on entry. **If you provide an e-mail address on your entry you agree that judging programs and armband numbers may be sent to you via e-mail.** The judging program will also be posted to the Trial Secretary website. Should exhibitor NOT receive an acknowledgment within a reasonable time, contact the Trial Secretary.

CHECK-IN, STAGING AREA, HANDLER'S BRIEFING, AND WARM-UP INFORMATION

Exhibitors MUST check-in EACH day they are entered as published in the Judging program.

Staging Area will be out of view of search area(s). Staging area may include crating, warm-up and waiting area, as well as the secretary table for check-ins and posting of running order and results.

The **Handler's Briefing** : Each handler will receive an individual briefing from the judge at the start line. In the Handler's Briefing the judge will explain if there's an off-leash option, number of hides, maximum height of hides and maximum time for the search.

A **warm-up area** will be available consisting of ONE marked container of each odor being tested at the trial and may also consist of blanks containers. Exhibitors should limit their warm-up to (2) two minutes or less. The warm-up area is to be used exclusively for warming up the handler-dog team prior to their run, or for recovery after the run. The warm-up area is not for training or relieving of the dog.

SEARCH AREA CONDITIONS

Search areas may be of any shape, and of the size specified in the Regulations for each class.

Searches may be indoors, on tiled or dirt surfaces, or outdoors on grass, gravel, dirt, concrete, or asphalt surfaces. Stairs may be present. Outdoor areas may or may not be covered.

ADDITIONAL SITE INFORMATION

Trial Site. It is not appropriate to visit the trial location to practice prior to the trial date. Many search locations are real-life environments and such visits may risk the host losing the opportunity to use the location in the future.

Prohibited. The use or possession of alcohol, marijuana, illegal drugs (in any form) and firearms (including fireworks of any kind) is absolutely prohibited. Any exhibitor found to be in possession of prohibited substances may be excused without benefit of refund if the Event Committee deems the exhibitor to be in violation of this requirement. If appropriate, law enforcement will be called.

Smoking. Oregon Law requires smokers to be at least 10 feet from any building. While there is no other ban on smoking on the Lane County Fairgrounds we ask that you be considerate of those around you and smoke (vaping included) inside personal vehicle in parking lot only.

Possession of Odors and Training. Chapter 5. Section 26 of the Scent Work Regulations state "No person other than those engaged in the administration of a trial shall be in possession of any target odor when on the trial grounds. There shall be no training on the grounds of the AKC Scent Work trial, other than the designated warm-up area".

Spectator Area. Spectators might not be allowed in the Search area. This will be left up to the judge. If allowed, any person not handling a dog in the current class, or any person who has already completed their run in the class may choose to watch the search from the spectator area. Handlers may not watch other exhibitors from their class prior to their run except in the case of Handler Discrimination classes. No one outside the search area may assist the handler or disclose the location of the hide. Spectators who intentionally or unintentionally give aid to a team may be ask to leave the area by the judge. Spectators are forbidden to discuss details of the search until the completion of the class.

Integrity of searches. If anyone is found to be discussing a search before classes have ended, all parties in the discussion will be penalized with a "not qualified" NQ for all classes entered that day, and will forfeit entry for subsequent days as well. For persons not entered, the Event Committee may ask those involved to leave.

Crating space may be available in doors. Crates may be left overnight; however, EDOC and the Lane County Fairgrounds will not be responsible for any lost or damaged items left at the show site. Dogs that bark excessively in the crating area may be asked to crate in vehicle. No dogs may be left in crating area overnight.

Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dog(s). Any exhibitor failing to do so may be excused without benefit of refund if the Event Committee deems the exhibitor to be in violation of this requirement. Cleaning supplies and disposal sites will be available at various locations around the show grounds.

Photos and Videos. Exhibitors are welcome to photograph and/or video their own dogs either by another person or using a Go-Pro camera or the like as permitted by AKC. Exhibitors are encouraged to share their own dogs searching on social media and/or website. No person should post photos or video of dogs they do not own without explicit permission from that dogs owner. Judges may photograph and/or video searches they are judging for the purpose of their own education. Judges photos and/or videos may not be displayed or used for any purpose other than their own viewing without explicit permission of EDOC and the dogs owners. Similar penalties as explained in the section "Integrity of Searches" may be imposed for violation of photo/video rules.

RIBBONS, AWARDS, AND PRIZES

A New Title Rosette will be awarded to dogs finishing an Odor Search Division Basic Level Title (SWN, SWA, SWE, SWM) Or Odor Search Division Elite Level Title (SWNE, SWAE, SWEE, or SWME) or Detective Title

HIGH IN TRIAL nor HIGH COMBINED DIVISION will not be awarded at these trials.

All awards should be claimed the day of the trial or the trial day following.

You will be required to confirm you have claimed your placement awards. Only placement awards not claimed will be mailed.

NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS

SAFETY, BEHAVIOR and LIABILITY

The safety of the dog is our primary concern. By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport, and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all searches safely. **It is expressly understood** that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create an unnecessary disturbance or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the trial committee, be asked to leave the show site. In such case, no refund of any fees paid will be made. Emerald Dog Obedience Club and its agents, employees, etc., will assume no responsibilities for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors or handlers, or to any of their dogs or property and further assumes no responsibility for injury to children. Emerald Dog Obedience Club reserves the right to decline entries for cause and may remove any dog on account of aggression. No one shall have any recourse or claim against the Emerald Dog Obedience Club or any official thereof.

Collars, Leashes and Harnesses. During searches, dogs must wear a properly fitted collar or harness approved by the judge. A wearable camera such as a Go Pro may be mounted to the dog's harness, if desired. Leashes may be of any length and/or retractable. The leash should be made of plain, pliable material.

All dogs must be on leash at all times while on fairgrounds. Retractable leashes may not be used when on fairgrounds (except during judged searches). Dogs must enter and exit the search area with the leash attached to the collar or harness, including when waiting in the search area before and after the search. An off-leash option may be offered at the discretion of the judge, only if the area is completely enclosed.

REFUNDS

No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, an act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee. No entry fee will be refunded in the event a dog is absent, disqualified, excused, or barred from competition by the action of the Trial Committee. Dogs pulled after closing because of injury or other medical condition are not eligible for a refund (exception see 'Wait List'.

Bitches in season will be refunded the full entry fee less \$5.00 cancellation fee may be obtained provided that a veterinarian's certificate and written notification is given to the trial secretary no later than one half hour prior to the start of the first class of the day of the first trial entered.

SEARCH STAGING

Judges are not required to wait for dogs. The Owner of each dog is solely responsible for having it ready at the search area when it is to be judged. The Club has no responsibility to provide service through a public address system or stewards or runners for the purpose of calling or locating dogs that are not brought into the staging area when required.

Exhibitors must notify staging steward of conflicts should they need to run out of order.

"Exhibitors should follow their veterinarian's recommendation to assure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, any communicable diseases, and have appropriate vaccinations." Additionally, clubs should include any specific local or state health requirements; for example, proof of rabies vaccination.

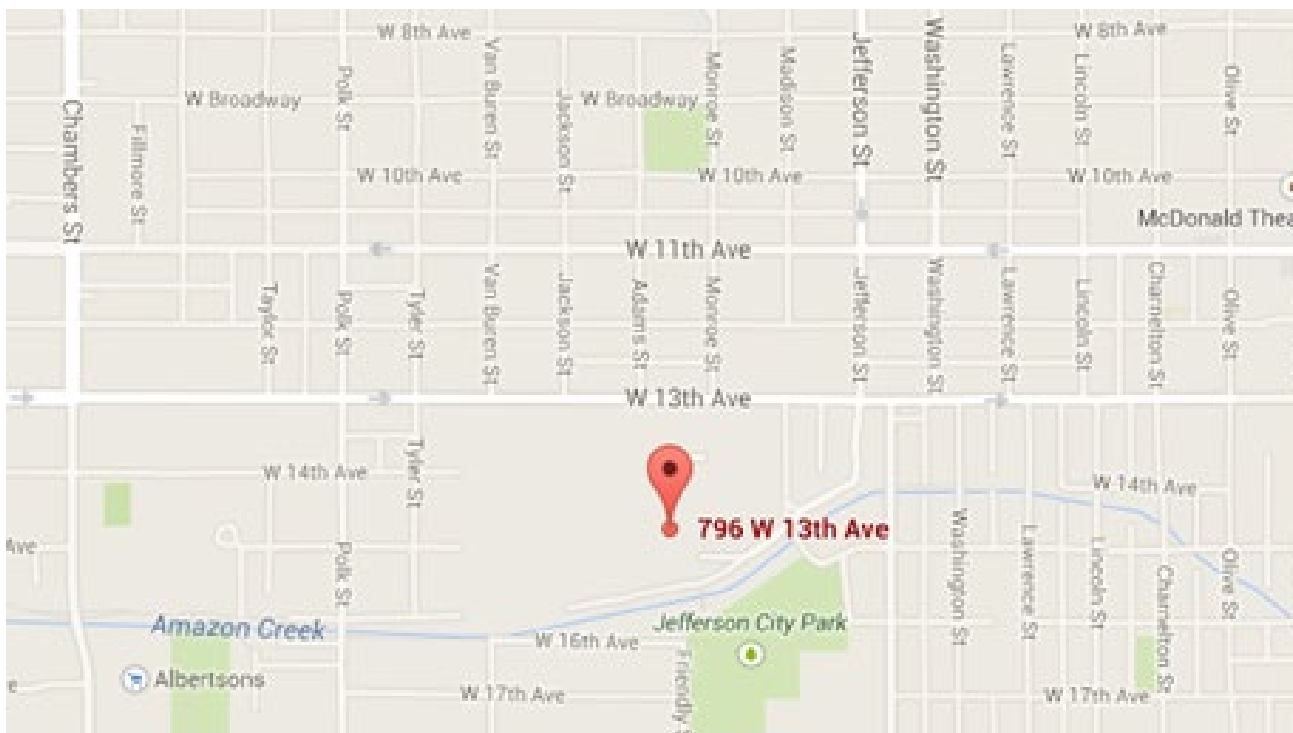

RV Parking

RV's and campers are allowed to park overnight on the grounds. RV's and campers must check in at the Business Office to obtain a permit. A 24 hr self-service permit station is available at the back door to the office. The permit cost is \$20 per night (non-refundable). All RV's must be self-contained. Limited water and electrical access is available on a first come, first served basis.

Hotels

You should also check with motels not in the Eugene/Springfield metro area such as Cottage Grove, Creswell, Junction City, or Brownsville.**

Parking is a privilege extended by EDOC and Lane County Fairgrounds. The Club reserves the right to withdraw this privilege from any person(s) who resorts to abusive language or does not abide by the rules and decisions of the Club or Fairgrounds.

There is no charge for day parking at these trials. Everyone is expected to leave their parking area clean. No parking in designated fire lanes or loading/unloading zones.
